This is a comparison review of test preparation databases.

Method

Three reviewers explored the test preparation and other materials included in Mometrix, PrepSTEP, and Testing and Education Resource Center (TERC). They tried out the PrepSTEP Tutorials on workplace skills and information literacy and the TERC résumé builder. They explored the test

preparation materials available from each product. They downloaded and tested ebooks using the Premier Tools ereader. They used Axe Accessibility engine to identify barriers to accessibility.

Conclusion/Recommendations

Although the products under review all serve a need for testing materials, all products have marked shortcomings. Two of the products being reviewed, PrepSTEP and Testing and Education Resource Center (TERC), require that users create a login with the database before they can even view content. Mometrix does not require a separate account, but users are unable to download, print, or save any of the content and the vendor does not provide any MARC records, so books cannot be easily added to a library's catalog.

PrepSTEP and TERC are user-friendly when it comes to downloading e-books since they don't have Digital Rights Management that put barriers or restrictions in place. The majority of materials in these collections are e-books. Even the practice tests that are dynamic are really just the multiple choice questions from a test prep booklet that have been animated.

PrepSTEP does include tutorials that break down content to teach material along with assessments. TERC and PrepSTEP both have a résumé builder.

If you are looking for a replacement for an oft-stolen print collection, all three products meet that need. However, all three products have serious accessibility issues.

Reviewers recommend libraries think about the tests their students are likely to take, then purchase the cheapest product that meets that need. These products are really e-book collections, with some limited "enhanced" content. None of them can replace a properly-designed online tutoring product -- but none of these databases purport to serve that need.

see which questions they answered correctly or incorrectly. If a question is answered incorrectly, student are given feedback that tries to tell them how to understand the correct answer. Students can take the test again, but it looks like only one practice test is provided.

No certificate is provided when students complete the tests.

For lessons like the one about having an appropriate attitude in the workplace, students receive feedback on their post-test results and are directed to the sections of the lesson they should review to strengthen areas of weakness.

college can find tests geared to CLEP, FCAT, SAT, ACT, PSAT, TAKS and more. Graduate school preps include GRE, LSAT, MCAT and MAT.

Strength may lie in graduate/professional school standardized exams.

There are even international tests covering TOEFL, TOEIC and U.S. citizenship.

User Interface

Students do not have to sign in to view tests or guides.

User can search by test title or browse by subject or profession. There is no option for creating an account.

On the main screen the content clearly findable by clicking on either "Study Guides" or "Practice Tests." Larger navigation page allows users to locate study guides by category - which includes Counseling, Career, Nutrition, English Language, Graduate and Professional School, etc.

Keyword search for exam/test also supported and is easy to execute, which is appropriate for a guide of this type.

There is no way to print or download materials.

There are no MARC records available.

Requires user to create an account and login before opening any books or tests.

User can search or browse, but it is very difficult to see which tests are included among the preparation materials so it would be important that students know the test they need in order to search for it to avoid frustration. Content is organized into 'centers' of related content for navigation.

Some tests and centers may be difficult for users to find as they are not intuitive or that logical - Example: the U.S. Citizenship Exam is in the "Build Workplace Skills" category in the Career and Workplace Preparation Module.

Some of these interface problems that make it difficult to find the desired material may be addressed by updates that EBSCO announced will be launched in February 2018.

Tests can be taken in practice mode which is untimed or simulation mode which is timed.

Many of the lessons are too textheavy for a tool that is intended to teach basic skills. Requires user to create an account and login before opening any books or tests.

User can search or browse for content.

MARC records are available.

Books are not restricted by DRM and can therefore be downloaded by users.

Customization

Two different versions of this product are offered: 2-year college edition (with emphasis on basic skills and college prep) and the 4-year college edition (includes graduate school preparation)

PrepSTEP can be purchased on its own or with the following modules: **Job and Career Accelerator** which includes modules for building résumés, assessing skills, and preparing for interviews; and **Computer Skills** - for - (includes Internet & Microsoft Office Basics).

Contains practice tests and ebooks. Practice tests are interactive and score can be saved. Users can stop mid test then come back to it.

Ebooks download as PDFs and can be saved or printed.

TERC can be purchased as a stand alone product or in conjunction with the Careers module.

The Career Module supports students interested in exploring careers suited towards their interests and personality and includes:

- Career assessment tool Provides users with a list of occupations that suit their personality. Users can then delve further into each career to learn about the skills involved in that particular field, salaries by state, and much more.
- Occupational database- Users can directly search and find key information on a specific occupation. The occupational list is from the Occupational Information Network (ONET), a database with more than 1,100 occupational types that was developed for the U.S. Department of Labor by the National O*NET consortium.

Mobile or Multimedia Options

The site is not optimized for mobile devices; the homepage does not resize to fit size of a phone.

Ebook text takes a while to load so content resized to fit on phone.

Practice tests can be taken on phone. Most of it dynamically resizes, but not the score reports.

Ebooks download and can be saved to IBooks or Dropbox or other apps.

Best mobile interface of all products. Practice tests can be taken on phone. Content dynamically resizes. Ebooks download and can be saved to IBooks or Dropbox or other apps.

Usage statistics are available and archived indefinitely, according to the vendor.

Usage reports can be generated to show usage by .. Center, Category, Subcategory, Topic and Resource.

detailed and extensive usage reports are available. (See diagram below)

Reports show login by UserID - include session date/time; duration per session and total duration for user account. Accounts show user names and IDs.

Usage reports available to librarian (site administrator) only.

Does not appear to support access with a proxy server.

There are difficulties in using this product with our proxy. Connection issues prevent us from using database with a proxy pre-pend. As a result any user can gain access to the product through our link.

Aside from institution name on product banner, no other customization available.

Links to "centers" and/or resources can be incorporated into LMS such as Canvas, but users will still need to login with username/password to access content; limited usefulness from instructor's POV.

Product does not have an administrator's module or interface.

Plugins for CMS not found, but according to <u>license terms</u> subscribers can incorporate parts of the licensed content into electronic course packs and electronic reserves.

Administrators can create custom hyperlinks to "Centers" for direct access. The 'My Center' feature enables users to save their work in progress, test results, eBooks, and other resources, to revisit at a later time.

Accessibility of Service

(Close-captioned videos, WAVE, Alt tags, etc.)

In questionnaire vendor says N/A to ADA/508 question. No text-only version is available to work with screen readers.

Using AXE on one page, 11 violations were found:

Buttons didn't have discernable text Elements didn't have sufficient color contrast

Frames didn't have title attributes Images didn't have alternative text.

These issues are considered critical.

On the homepage, the videos don't have captions and all of the same violations appear.

Combined with n/a in answer in questionnaire I'm going to say this product isn't accessible and vendor has no interest in making it accessible.

Using AXE 45 violations were found on the homepage. 44 were considered critical:

Buttons didn't have discernible text

Elements didn't have sufficient color contrast

31 id attribute values weren't unique

Images didn't have alternate text

Form elements didn't have labels

In a practice test 273 violations were found, 153 critical, the rest serious: Elements didn't have sufficient color contrast




The Mometrix interface is straightforward. There are no bells or whistles. Of the three test preparation products we reviewed, it has the smallest amount of content of all three but is a strong choice for supporting career/technical programs.




The homepage makes it easy to browse or search for study guides.



This screenshot shows how the list of practice tests is displayed. Mometrix includes practice tests for Accuplacer, which is used at some colleges to inform placement recommendations for students entering English, math, and reading sequences.



This screenshot is an example of a practice test. Because students cannot set up an account, their completion of practice tests will not be recorded as it is in the other two test preparation products we reviewed. This means that the tests are easy for students to access but that they cannot easily be assigned by faculty to students for credit in their courses.





The study guides in Mometrix are formatted as eBooks. That means they are not interactive but they can be downloaded. The screenshot is an example of a study guide.

The screenshot is an example of the study guide content, which is text heavy and does not offer interactivity.

Anatomy and Physiology

Anatomical position

The anatomical position is the medical standard used when describing the orientation and location of the parts of the human body. A body in the anatomical position stands with the feet facing to the front. The hips and shoulders are square and level. The feet are placed slightly apart. The arms are held straight at the sides of the body with the palms of the hands facing forward. The little fingers are therefore nearest the body, and the thumbs point away from the body. The arms do not touch the body, but are held close to it. The head faces forward, as do the eyes.

Anatomical terms

 ${\it Medial}$: Nearer to the midline of the body. In anatomical position, the little finger is medial to the thumb.

Lateral: Opposite of medial. It refers to structures further away from the body's midline, at the sides. In anatomical position, the thumb is lateral to the little finger.

Proximal: Structures closer to the center of the body. The hip is proximal to the knee.

 ${\it Distal}$: Structures further away from the center of the body. The knee is distal to the hip.





The screenshot of the homepage illustrates that it is hard to know everything that is included when first entering the tool and there is no easy way to browse the content. The "carousel" display of content is scheduled to be replaced by an easier-to-navigate frontpage design in February 2018.







PrepSTEP has the most content of all three of the test preparation tools that we reviewed, though that does depend on which modules your library chooses to subscribe to. The cost increases significantly as you add the career/technical and/or computer skills modules. The screenshot shows an example of content from PrepSTEP. It illustrates the multiple materials that are often available for each content area.

The test preparation guides are eBooks, which can be downloaded and printed. They do not offer any interactivity. The screenshots illustrate that the guides are text-based. Students cannot access the eBooks until they create a PrepSTEP account.






Because users must log in to open eBooks and practice tests, students' responses to practice tests are automatically saved and students can return to complete tests later. The screenshot illustrates the practice test interface.



Students' practice test results are saved in their account. Test results include detailed feedback and suggestions for a study plan based on students' performance. Because students receive their results, they can share them with faculty who have assigned the practice tests for assignment credit. The screenshot illustrates the score report that students receive.





The default search page is pictured below. It requires users to select an appropriate learning path based on their educational goal or student type. Only after making a selection can the user conduct a search for testing materials or other content.





Screenshot shows customized learning path for college prep. Creation of user profiles (username/ID) allows for saving of test results. Content is customized for user based on results of pre-test.



The Career Module is available as an add-on to TERC and features a career assessment tool (a multiple-choice exam that determines users' Holland Type and maps to suitable job categories, industries, and occupations) a résumé and cover letter builder, and interviewing tips.
